Indiana Family and Social Service Administration

In Indiana, PCG convened stakeholder workgroups to produce policy recommendations for the Family and Social Service Administration (FSSA) leveraging quality improvement facilitation methods to improve the Medicaid Home Health program. Each workgroup consists of an interprofessional group of stakeholders with representation ranging from the Department of Health, Payor Services, Rates and Reimbursement,

Governmental Affairs, and Provider Agencies. Over the course of eighteen months, PCG will have assisted FSSA with five home health issue-specific workgroups with the goals of developing new policies that complement Medicare, Medicaid, State Plan, and waiver services reduces administrative burden on families by improving access to home health services and maximizes workforce supply and efficacy.



Colorado Medicaid Respite Care Program

In Colorado, PCG identified and engaged 100+ key stakeholders across the state to identify effective solutions and policy recommendations to improve the Medicaid Respite Care Program. We facilitated stakeholder input gathering sessions which included 150+ survey responses, four focus groups, and 10 key informant interviews.
